

During this training, you will learn about Potomac Riverkeeper Network's role in preventing pollution in our watershed and the role of Community Science in our Swimmable Potomac Campaign, learn the field and lab methods for collecting and reading water quality samples, get hands-on experience practicing water sample collection and take our Community Science Water Quality Monitor Volunteer test to become certified within our program!

Earth Day Clean Up - Saturday, April 22



Join Potomac Riverkeeper Network and our partners as we bring our communities together to celebrate Earth Day by giving back!

In celebration of Earth Day, Potomac Riverkeeper Network volunteers will provide the hands and bodies to remove trash and debris from the recreational and natural areas along the Oxon Cove shoreline. At last year's cleanup at Oxon Cove, our 191

volunteers removed 281 bags of trash: over 7000 plastic bottles, 17 car tires, and 5 shopping carts! This year our volunteers will return to clean up the park to protect public lands and to create a safer place for the community to gather.

We welcome volunteers of all ages to help remove single-use plastics and trash along the shoreline of Oxon Cove and Oxon Run. Please be prepared and dress accordingly. Wear clothes you don't mind getting a little wet and muddy. If you have knee-high rubber boots or waders, we recommend wearing them so you can help us tackle the trash below the shoreline. Be sure to bring a snack and a reusable water bottle!

In order to not overcrowd our volunteers, our event will be running in two shifts. One from 9am - 11:30am and the other from 12pm - 2:30pm. There will be access points on both the DC and the Maryland sides of the Cove.
